New Legislative Bills of 2019 that impact the construction and design industry.

SB 369 — (Substantial Completion Definition) Modifies Statute of limitations for action against architect, landscape architect or engineer arising out of construction, alteration or repair of improvements to real property. Modifies definition of substantial completion for purposes of statute of limitation for action arising out of construction, alteration or repair of improvement to real property. *September 29, 2019*

SB 455 — (Requires Higher Ed to Use Apprentices) *Effective date January 1, 2020* Requires certain institutions of higher education and community colleges to require contractors to employ apprentices and to establish and execute plan for outreach, recruitment and retention of women and minority individuals for certain work relating to improvements to real property.

SB 471 — (Conflict Minerals) *Effective date September 29, 2019, operative January 1, 2021*

SB 494 — (QRF Subminimum Wage) *Effective date September 29, 2019* - Can no longer pay subminimum wages to individuals with disability.

HB 2007 — (Clean Diesel) *Effective when the Governor Signs it, operative January 1, 2020* Relating to engine emissions; and declaring an emergency. Extends authorized uses of moneys received by state pursuant to Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement and deposited in Clean Diesel Engine Fund.

HB 2094 — (Consideration of State Debt Taxes etc Prior to Award) *Effective date September 29, 2019, operative January 1, 2020*

HB 2415 — (Retainage in Escrow Required for Contracts over \$500K) *Effective date January 1, 2020*
Requires that retainage be placed in interest-bearing escrow account if contract price exceeds \$500,000.

The interest shall commence 30 days after receipt of the invoice from the contractor or 15 days after the payment is approved by the contracting agency, whichever is the earlier date. The rate of interest charged to the contracting agency on the amount due shall equal three times the discount rate on 90-day commercial paper in effect at the Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district that includes Oregon on the date that is 30 days after receipt of the invoice from the contractor or 15 days after the payment is approved by the contracting agency, whichever is the earlier date, but the rate of interest may not exceed 30 percent.

HB 2415 — Enrolled *Effective date 1/1/20.* Prohibits retainage or performance security deduction from portion of progress payment relating to cost of materials or equipment stored at job site. Prohibits retainage if contractor has supplied performance security equivalent to full amount that can be deducted as retainage on original contract price. Limits ability to refuse acceptance of performance security.

- Requires that retainage be placed in interest-bearing escrow account if contract price exceeds \$250,000. Specifies interest accrual period.
- Prohibits contractor retainage on payments to first-tier subcontractor made after 50 percent of work is completed if work is deemed progressing satisfactorily.
- Establishes deadlines for payment of retainage after acceptance of work. Establishes requirement for payment of interest if retainage is not timely paid. Provides entitlement to costs and attorney fees to prevailing plaintiff in action for release of retainage amount due.
- Requires written statement and certification of good faith if payment of retainage is withheld due to incomplete or defective work items or due to filed and documented claims. Limits amounts that may be withheld from release of retainage.
- Makes offering of written contract form not meeting statutory progress payment or retainage provisions violation subject to fine, not to exceed \$2,000. [see 2017 HB 2148]

HB 2469 (Green Energy Technology updates) *Effective date September 29, 2019, operative*

Includes battery storage in definition of "green energy technology." Defines "total contract price." Permits contracting agency, as alternative to including green energy technology in construction, reconstruction or major renovation of public building, to make expenditure to improve energy use efficiency in public building. requirement to show results of analysis of total solar resource fraction that applies to site on which contracting agency intends to construct green energy technology that uses solar energy for space or water heating or to generate electricity. Permits contracting agency to use green energy for space or water heating or to generate electricity if total solar resource fraction exceeds 75 percent. Permits contracting agency to enter into agreement with another contracting agency to pool resources or share costs related to including green energy technology or woody biomass energy technology or making expenditure to improve building energy use efficiency in construction, reconstruction or major renovation] *Becomes operative on January 1, 2020. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. January 1, 2020*

HB 2769 (QBS) - *Effective date September 29, 2019, operative January 1, 2020* Permits contracting agency, in conducting procurement for architectural, engineering photo mapping, transportation planning and land survey services to consider pricing policies, proposals and other pricing information as screening selection of consultants.

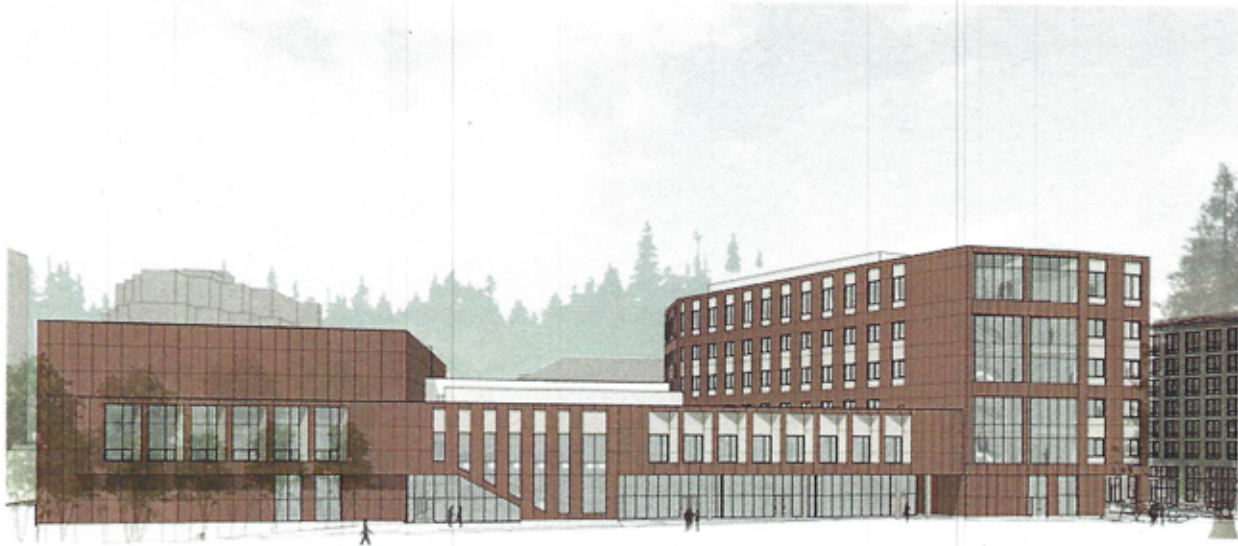

General Contractor Requirements

Vendors need to meet certain basic requirements to do business with the City. The following are those requirements that apply to most contracts. Check other sections of our site for requirements specific to construction contracts and apparel contracts.

Current Portland Business License Tax Account

In order to do business with the City, your Portland Business License Tax Account must be current. This applies to both resident and non-resident vendors. Access a copy of your certificate of compliance or manage your business tax account (or register if you don't have an account) on the Revenue Bureau Business Taxes website or call their office at 503-823-5157.

Nonresident Bidder Form

Nonresident bidders that are awarded a contract that exceeds \$10,000 in value must report the award to the Oregon Department of Revenue on a Non-Resident Bidder Form. Vendors should then forward a copy to the City. This requirement must be met before the City issues final payment on the contract.

Equal Benefits Compliance

City contractors are required to provide benefits to their employees with domestic partners equivalent to those provided to employees with spouses. Use our Online Procurement Center to register your Equal Benefits status. Per the City's Equal Benefits Ordinance, registration is required for contracts that meet or exceed the "formal" dollar threshold.

Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Certification

The City of Portland requires EEO certification of all vendors and contractors doing business with the City in excess of \$2,500 annually, and of all construction project sub-contractors.

In order to be EEO certified, your firm must fill out the online form at our Online Procurement Center stating that it does not discriminate against any employee or applicant on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, marital status, national origin, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or source of income. Your company must also take steps to ensure equal opportunity in all aspects of employment. These aspects include, but are not limited to, hiring, promotion, transfer, advertising, layoff, termination, rates of pay, training (including apprenticeship), and terms and conditions of employment.

MWESB Program Participation

Depending upon the project or solicitation the City may require contractors to pursue minority-owned, women-owned, or emerging small business (MWESB) participation. Check the Social Equity Contracting section of our website for further information.
