We Want to Remind Everyone of the Eligibility Requirements for D/M/WBE and SDV

In order to qualify for D/M/WBE and SDV certification the applicant must own at least 51% of the firm, be able to control and manage the daily operations of the firm, and hold any professional licensing necessary to operate the business (i.e., engineer, architect, plumber, electrician, etc.).

To qualify for ESB certification, the business must meet the SBA size standards for a small business. This includes number of employees and average gross receipts cap determined from over a three-year period.

PBDG clearly understands these requirements and feels that while there are legitimate woman-owned there are many that are NON compliant. We will be asking FHWA and ODOT to review those that are DBE, ODOT to review the WBEs, and the Secretary of State's Office to review their lack of compliance.

We ask that public agencies and prime contractors be very aware of the status of the CoBid certified firms you are using.



Legacy Health, Prosper Portland and the City of Portland have agreed to develop a vacant 1.7 acre block at North Russell Street and North Williams Avenue currently owned by Legacy Health.
